

Addendum to Grafton SOS COVID Safety Plan.

Player and Spectator wellbeing.

- Spectators will be discouraged. Teams have been informed that as far as possible only players should attend.
- Sport NSW signage will be displayed prominently around the canteen area where all those attending will be signing in reminding people of the current regulations and guidelines.
- Hand sanitiser will be provided near the sign in sheets and everyone attending will be reminded to use this.
- All players and non-players will be required to complete a sign in sheets on arrival that will not only ask for the relevant contact details, but will ask those attending to confirm they have not been to Victoria in the last 14 days and that they are currently well and not displaying any signs of illness.
- Several Committee members of Grafton SOS have completed Department of Health Infection Control Training and one of these will be acting as safety officer throughout the time that people connected with Grafton SOS are present at the venue.

Physical Distancing

- On arrival, the attention of players and non-players will be drawn to the Sport NSW signage that will be displayed near the signing in sheets.
- The safety officer will brief teams about the need and regulations regarding physical distancing and will circulate during games to monitor players, substitutes, officials and any spectators to ensure they conform to these regulations.
- Players and non-players will be reminded not to congregate before, between and after games.
- All those present will be encouraged to leave promptly after games.

Hygiene and Cleaning

- Hand sanitiser will be provided near the signing in sheets and everyone will be encouraged to use this on arrival.
- Hand sanitiser and soap will be provided in the restrooms and will be checked regularly by the safety officer.
- On arrival, players and non-players will be reminded of the need to maintain hygiene and of the regulations and guidelines for best practice.
- Touch surfaces will be monitored and cleaned regularly, particularly in between games.

Record keeping.

- All those present on the fields will be required to complete a sign on sheet on arrival that will record players and non-players names and contact details.
- Sign on sheets will be kept for 28 days or longer as required by the latest government requirements.
